INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT THURSDAY JUNE 5, 2003 - 0530 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 123 new fires reported. Four new large fires were reported, one in the Eastern Great Basin and three in the Southern Area. Three large fires were contained in the Southern Area. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, Texas and Utah.

ALASKA AREA LARGE FIRES:

TOK RIVER, State of Alaska. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Reed) is assigned. The fire is burning in black spruce, tundra and mixed hardwoods, five miles southeast of Tok, AK. Minimal fire activity was observed yesterday, with creeping, smoldering and some isolated torching. Line construction and mopup will continue today.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

DRY LAKES COMPLEX, Gila National Forest. A Fire Use Management Team (Rath) is assigned. This lightning caused Wildland Fire Use fire is 27 miles northwest of Silver City, NM and is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. The fire is burning in pinyon and ponderosa pine, brush and juniper. Active fire behavior was observed yesterday, with rapid upslope runs on steep slopes. Continued monitoring is planned for today.

APACHE, Santa Fe National Forest. This fire is burning in pinyon and ponderosa pine approximately three miles west of Barillas Peak, NM. The fire is in a confinement strategy. Continued securing and holding of control lines is planned for today.

OUTLOOK:

Weather Discussion: High pressure will remain in control of western weather today, keeping conditions dry and warm. Breezy wind will be in place across Montana and Idaho as a series of storms drop into the central Great Plains from Alberta. In the central and southeastern states, a frontal system will produce showers and thunderstorms in the Plains, eastern New Mexico, western Texas, and Florida. In Alaska, low pressure in the northern Pacific will drift northward toward the Alaska Peninsula, causing showers along the southern coast. Interior sections will remain mainly dry.
