## INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT THURSDAY JUNE 10, 2004 – 0530 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 1

## **CURRENT SITUATION:**

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 88 fires reported. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Alaska, Arizona, Colorado, Georgia, Kansas, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas, Utah and Wyoming.

## SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA AREA LARGE FIRES:

GAVIOTA, Santa Barbara County Fire Department. A California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection Type 1 Incident Command Team (Henson) is assigned. This fire is 15 miles west of Santa Barbara, CA in chaparral and grass. Inaccessible terrain, limited roads, dry fuels and persistent winds continue to be major concerns. Fire behavior has moderated significantly. Minimal activity was observed.

CASTLE, Tulare Unit, California Department of Forestry & Fire Protection. This fire is one half mile northeast of Woodlake, CA in grass. Steep terrain and rolling materials are major concerns. No further information was received.

# SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

THREE FORKS, Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Kvale) has been ordered. This fire is 11 miles west of Alpine, AZ in ponderosa pine and mixed conifer. Active fire behavior and high winds produced torching, short crown runs and profuse spotting.

PEPPIN, Lincoln National Forest. This fire is six miles northeast of Capitan, NM in timber. Steep terrain, poor accessibility, heavy fuel loading, prolonged drought and high winds continue to be major concerns. Moderate surface fire continues with the south and west flanks being the most active.

KP, Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest. This fire is 20 miles south of Alpine, AZ in brush and mixed conifer. Minimal fire activity was observed. No further information was received.

## **ROCKY MOUNTAIN AREA LARGE FIRES:**

GREASEWOOD, White River Field Office, Bureau of Land Management. A Fire Use Management Team (Cook) is assigned. This lightning–caused Wildland Fire Use (WFU) incident is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. This fire is 17 miles southwest of Meeker, CO in grass and sage brush. Active fire behavior with running, crowning, torching and spotting resulted in significant fire growth.

BENT CANYON, Pike and San Isabel National Forest. This fire is 24 miles south of La Junta, CO in grass and pinyon-juniper. Increase in acreage was due to more accurate mapping. No further information was received.

PURGATORY, Pueblo County. This fire is 20 miles south of La Junta, CO in grass, brush and hardwood timber. Minimal fire activity was reported.
