INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT THURSDAY JUNE 17, 2004 – 0530 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 1

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 201 fires reported. Two new large fires were reported, one each in the Eastern Great Basin and Southern California Areas. Two large fires were contained, one each in the Eastern Great Basin and Southern Areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Kansas, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas and Utah.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

SEDGWICK, Cibola National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Winchester) is assigned. This fire is 17 miles west of Grants, NM in ponderosa pine. No new information was reported.

THREE FORKS, Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Kvale) is assigned. This fire is 11 miles west of Alpine, AZ in ponderosa pine and mixed conifer. No new information was reported.

PEPPIN, Lincoln National Forest. This fire is six miles northeast of Capitan, NM in timber. Steep terrain, poor accessibility, heavy fuel loading, prolonged drought and high winds continue to be major concerns. Large islands of fuel inside the perimeter continue to burn.

This complex is two miles east of Dammeron Valley, UT in grass, brush, pinyon pine and juniper. Active fire behavior with torching and spotting three hundred yards ahead of the flame front was observed. The community of Brookside has been evacuated.

OUTLOOK:

Red Flag Warning: Northern California's northern and western sections of the Sacramento Valley for breezy north winds and low relative humidity.

North Slope of the Alaska Range and the Copper River Basin for strong south winds through Thursday.

Weather Discussion: A weakening upper level trough will move across the Southwest today as another stronger low settles over western Montana. High pressure building off the Pacific Northwest coast will slowly move northward into the Gulf of Alaska. Moisture across the west-central United States will produce showers and thunderstorms today from northern California eastward through the Great Basin. Some isolated dry thunderstorms are also possible in northern New Mexico and southwest Colorado. In Alaska, winds along the Alaska Range will be strong until high pressure builds over the region overnight.
