## INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT SUNDAY, JUNE 19, 2005 – 0800 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 1

#### **CURRENT SITUATION:**

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 71 new fires reported. Two new large fires were reported, one each in the Southwest and the Southern California Areas. Two large fires were contained, one each in the Alaska and Southwest Areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Alaska, Oregon, Washington, California, Nevada, Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, and Kansas.

#### **SOUTHWEST AREA INCIDENTS / LARGE FIRES:**

AZTEC, Coronado National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Raley) is assigned. This fire is five miles south of Patagonia, AZ in grass and brush. The communities of Harshaw and Flux Canyon had optional evacuations. Extreme fire behavior with rapid rates of spread and spotting was observed.

NORTH GILA COMPLEX, Gila National Forest. A Fire Use Management Team (Hall) is assigned. This lightning-caused Wildland Fire Use (WFU) complex, comprised of the Fork and Johnson fires, is 13 miles southeast of Reserve, NM in timber and grass. The complex is being managed to accomplish multiple resource objectives. Burn-out operations are aiding in achieving objectives. Low to moderate fire behavior was observed.

#### **ALASKA AREA INCIDENTS / LARGE FIRES:**

SHEENJEK RIVER, Alaska Fire Service, Upper Yukon Zone. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Kurth) is assigned. This fire started on Fish and Wildlife Service land 23 miles north of Ft. Yukon, AK in birch, aspen, black and white spruce. Cabins and outbuildings remain threatened. Red flag conditions with high winds challenged firefighting efforts. Active runs in all fuel types, along with torching and spotting in mixed spruce stands were reported.

GROUNDHOG, Alaska Division of Forestry, Southwest Area. This fire is ten miles northwest of Nondalton, AK in timber and tundra. Crews secured the fire perimeter. Smoldering fire behavior was reported.

### **SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA AREA INCIDENTS / LARGE FIRES:**

PIONEER, California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection, San Bernardino Unit. This fire is four miles west of Yucca Valley in brush and grass. Steep terrain and high winds are hampering containment efforts. There have been some evacuations in the community of Pioneer. Moderate fire behavior with spotting was reported.

#### **OUTLOOK:**

**Red Flag Warnings:** Red Flag Warning in effect for high winds through 10 PM Sunday for the northeastern Interior of Alaska.

**Fire Weather Watches:** Sunday for east-central Nevada for strong winds and low humidity. Portions of northwest Arizona for strong winds and low humidity.

**Weather Discussion**: Upper low remains off the West but high pressure will build over the West bringing warmer temperatures. Gusty winds will continue over the Great Basin, but they will not be as strong as the last few days. In Alaska, a frontal system will spread rain into the western and central interior with high pressure over the northeast keeping that area relatively dry.
