### INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT SUNDAY, OCTOBER 16, 2005 – 0800 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

### CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 36 fires reported. One new large fire was reported in the Western Great Basin Area. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, California, and Utah.

A Presidential Disaster Declaration was issued for Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in Mississippi, Alabama, Louisiana and Texas. Two Area Command Teams (Ribar and Williams-Rhodes) are assigned.

Ribar's Team is at Foley, AL providing coordination for incident management operations in Mississippi for FEMA Region IV. Williams-Rhodes Team is coordinating relief operations in Louisiana and Texas (FEMA Region VI). The Marietta Mobilization Center in Marietta, GA continues to house and in-brief Incident Management Teams and other resources prior to assignment.

### SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS / LARGE FIRES:

<u>HURRICANE KATRINA SUPPORT</u>, Federal Emergency Management Agency. Emergency Support Function (ESF) #4 at the state Emergency Operations Centers in Jackson, MS and Baton Rouge, LA are staffed.

Seven Type 2 Incident Management Teams (Johnson, Goheen, Stewart, Whalen, Floyd, Carlson, and LaFave) are assigned.

Johnson: managing base camps at Gulfport and Vancleave, MS.

Goheen: managing a mobilization center and base camp at Camp Beauregard, near Pineville, LA.

Stewart: assessing timber damage and coordinating wildfire presuppression and initial attack planning in Hammond, LA.

Whalen: managing a receiving and distribution center and supporting a mobilization center at Bossier City, LA. A transfer of command to a Type 2 Incident Management Team (Floyd) has begun.

Carlson: managing the Jackson Support Base in the New Orleans French Quarter and supporting several satellite camps in southern Louisiana.

LaFave: managing distribution sites in Hancock County from a base camp at Stennis Space Center, MS.

<u>HURRICANE RITA SUPPORT</u>, Federal Emergency Management Agency. Emergency Support Function (ESF) #4 at the state Emergency Operations Centers in Austin, TX is staffed.

Type 1 Incident Management Team (Molumby) is supporting distribution centers and several emergency operations centers in three counties and managing a base camp at Ford Park Arena, Beaumont, TX.

## WESTERN GREAT BASIN AREA INCIDENTS / LARGE FIRES

PRUNTY RANCH, Elko Field Office, Bureau of Land Management. This fire is 60 miles north of Elko, NV in brush and grass. Private property, sage grouse and mule deer habitat are threatened. Occasional spotting and torching and uphill runs were observed.

**Red Flag Warning**: For northern Florida from Jacksonville west through the panhandle for low relative humidity.

**Fire Weather Watch**: For northern and central Alabama and Georgia for low relative humidity, low fuel moisture, and wind.

**Weather Discussion:** A low pressure system centered over southern California will bring precipitation to portions of Southern California, the Southwest, and the Great Basin Areas. Gusty winds are expected over northern California. High pressure will continue to bring warm, dry weather to most of the Southern Area.
