INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT SUNDAY, MAY 14, 2006 – 1000 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 17 new fires reported. Two new large fires (*) were reported, one each in the Southern California and Eastern Great Basin Areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, Oklahoma, New Mexico and Texas.

SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

ARECA, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire started on private land six miles northwest of Sharpes, FL in southern rough. No new information was reported.

WF NEW SMYRNA 44/95, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is one mile west of New Smyrna, FL in southern rough. No new information was reported.

RASELY ROAD, Florida Division of Forestry. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Beauchamp) is assigned. The team is also managing the WF New Smyrna 44/95 fire. No new information was reported.

BERG, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is 14 miles south of Belle Grade, FL in grass. No new information was reported.

TOSOHATCHEE, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is six miles southwest of Titusville, FL in timber and southern rough. No new information was reported.

BIG BEND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Osceola County, FL in southern rough. No new information was reported.

29 POWELL, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Hillsborough County, FL in grass. No new information was reported.
