# INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT FRIDAY, MAY 19, 2006 – 0530 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

#### **CURRENT SITUATION:**

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 129 new fires reported. Five new large fires (\*) were reported, three in the Southwest Area, and one each in the Southern and Western Great Basin Areas. Ten large fires were contained, seven in the Southern Area, two in the Southwest Area, and one in the Western Great Basin Area. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas and Utah.

#### SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

WF NEW SMYRNA 44/95, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is one mile west of New Smyrna, FL in southern rough. Numerous residences remain threatened. Some flare-ups were reported within the fire's perimeter.

WF POSSUM CAMP, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is two miles west of Edgewater, FL in southern rough and timber. Minimal fire activity was reported.

TANYARD, Texas Forest Service. This fire is eight miles east of New Waverly, TX in timber. Creeping and smoldering were observed.

B & B, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire started on private land 12 miles south of Tahlequah, OK in hardwood litter. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

FRIDAY ROAD, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Brevard County, FL in grass. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

#### **OUTLOOK:**

**Fire Weather Watches:** In effect across all of Florida. Relative humidity values below 35% are expected to last more than four hours. For northeast Utah for scattered dry thunderstorms Friday afternoon and evening, and for western Colorado for dry lightning.

**Weather Discussion:** Warm, dry and somewhat windy conditions in Florida, and a mixture of wet and dry thunderstorms in the West will continue today. The strong high pressure in the West will be moving eastward today as a low pressure trough approaches the West Coast.
