INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT TUESDAY, MAY 23, 2006 – 0530 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 152 new fires reported. Thirteen new large fires (*) were reported, 12 in the Southwest Area and one in the Southern Area. Ten large fires were contained in the Southwest Area. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, Colorado, Kansas and Utah.

SOUTHWEST AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

ROMERO, Coronado National Forest. A Type 1 Incident Management Team (Oltrogge) is assigned. This fire is six miles southeast of Oro valley, AZ in brush. Numerous residences and archeological sites are threatened. Moderate to intense runs and backing fire were reported. Steep, rough and rocky terrain along with rolling debris is hampering suppression efforts.

NORTH TAYLOR, Coronado National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Raley) is assigned. This fire is 19 miles southwest of Safford, AZ in timber and brush. Moderate to extreme wind driven activity with uphill runs and torching were reported. Difficult access due to steep and rocky terrain is hampering containment efforts.

GARLEY, Cibola National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Lineback) is assigned. The incident is being managed under a unified command with Laguna Pueblo. A transfer of command back to the local unit will occur on 5/24. This fire is six miles north of Cubero, NM in hardwood litter. Steep and inaccessible terrain is hampering containment efforts. A watershed and game habitat remain threatened. Fire activity was limited to interior smoldering logs, stumps and snags.

BRILLIANT #2, New Mexico State Forestry, Cimarron District. This fire is five miles west of Raton, NM in pine and brush. Down drafts from thunderstorms produced several heads. High temperatures and difficult terrain are hampering containment efforts. Residences and a power line serving the community of Raton remain threatened.

ADOBE, Socorro District, New Mexico State Forestry. This fire is 28 miles southeast of Animas, NM in pine and mixed conifer forest and grass. Extreme fire behavior with runs across Adobe Creek, spotting and torching were observed. Burn out operations are ongoing. Difficult access and heavy fuel loading are hampering containment efforts.

LEVI, Las Vegas District, New Mexico State Forestry. This fire is two miles northwest of Wagon Mound, NM in grass and timber. Wildlife habitat remains threatened. No further information was received.

CABRA, Las Vegas District, New Mexico State Forestry. This fire is 40 miles northwest of Tucumcari, NM in grass, pinyon pine and juniper. Moderate fire behavior was reported. No further information was received.

CAPULIN, Bandelier National Monument. This fire is 23 miles west of Santa Fe, NM in ponderosa pine, pinyon pine, juniper and grass. The fire is lined and line improvement continues.

78, Cibola National Forest. This fire is 15 miles east of Dalhart, TX in grass. No new information was reported.

LOST, Truxton Canyon Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs. This fire is near Peach Springs, AZ in grass and brush. Line improvement continues. No further information was received.

PIPELINE, Roswell Field Office, Bureau of Land Management. This fire is 32 miles northeast of Capitan, NM in grass and yucca. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

DEVILS CANYON, Texas Forest Service. This fire is 12 miles north east of Valentine, TX in grass and brush. Active fire behavior with runs to the northeast was reported. Burn out operations continue.

WF POSSUM CAMP, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is two miles west of Edgewater, FL in southern rough and timber. Minimal fire activity was reported.

NEGLEY, Texas Forest Service. This fire is 35 miles northeast of Paris, TX in timber. Running and crown fire was observed. No further information was received.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

DOUBLE-UP, Las Vegas District, Bureau of Land Management. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Brunner) is assigned. This fire started on Forest Service land 23 miles southwest of Las Vegas, NV in juniper and pinyon pine. A communication site on Mt. Potosi is threatened. Smoldering, creeping and single tree torching were reported.

OUTLOOK:

Fire Weather Watches: Northeastern New Mexico, the northern Texas Panhandle, and the Guadalupe mountains area for strong southwest winds and low humidity. Fire weather watch for the Colorado Front Range for strong winds and low humidity. For the northern half of interior Florida for minimum humidity in the low 30 percent. For the Texas Panhandle for low humidity (10%) and gusty southerly winds to 35 mph.

Weather Discussion: A low pressure trough will move across the Rockies and into the northern Plains today with strong winds and dry conditions for portions of New Mexico, Colorado, and west Texas. Scattered thunderstorms will spread across much of the Plains.
