**Sweat Farm Road**, Georgia Forestry Commission. IMT 2 (Floyd) and NIMO (Ferguson). Started on private land 10 miles southeast of Waycross, GA. Southern rough and timber. Flame lengths up to 100 feet. School closures and evacuations in place.

**Big Turnaround**, Okefenokee NWR. IMT 2 (Wilder). Ten miles southeast of Waycross, GA. Southern rough, timber and gallberry. Torching, spotting and flanking fire.

**Burns Lake**, Big Cypress National Preserve. Eight miles east of Ochopee, FL. Southern rough. Backing fire.

**Friar,** George Washington & Jefferson NF. Five miles north of Amherst, VA. Hardwood litter. Backing fire with short runs. Residences, outbuildings and power lines threatened.

**Two Sided,** Eglin Air Force Base. Two miles south of Holt, FL. Southern rough. No further information received.

**New Berry**, National Forests in North Carolina. Three miles north of Old Fort, NC. Timber. No new information.

#### NO COMMUNICATION LINK WITH CREW MEMBERS, SUPERVISORS & ADJOINING FORCES

Watchout Situation #7 is a danger that must be mitigated by maintaining good communications while working on fires. Firefighters must constantly ask themselves the following questions as situations change on the fireline:

- Can communications be established?
  - Talk about how communications are set up on fires.
  - Review situations where communications were a problem and what was done to fix the problem.
- Is the communication triangle complete?
  - Review the communication triangle and where it comes up in the "10 Standard Fire Orders" and the "18 Watchout Situations."
  - Discuss ways that firefighters can maintain the communication triangle on the fireline.
- Reduce the risks
  - If the situation is complex, wait until communications are in place.
  - Talk about the fires where crews had to leave the line, didn't go out on the line, or something negative happened because communications were inadequate. Discuss what was done to establish communications.
