**Sweat Farm Road**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Floyd) to IMT 2 (Hanneman). NIMO (Ferguson). Started on private land 10 miles west of Waycross, GA. Southern rough and timber. Moderate rates of spread. U.S. Highway 1 remains closed.

**Big Turnaround Complex**, Okefenokee NWR. IMT 1 (Ruggiero). Ten miles southeast of Waycross, GA. Southern rough, timber and gallberry. Moderate fire activity. Private timber plantations remain threatened. Backing fire.

**Round About Swamp**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Started on private land four miles west of Pearson, GA. Southern rough and timber. Active fire behavior. Numerous structures remain threatened.

**Pinnacle**, National Forests in North Carolina. IMT 2 (Raley). Fifteen miles east of North Cove, NC. Hardwood litter and timber. No fire activity report due to heavy fog.

**Knee Knocker Swamp**, Georgia Forestry Commission. One mile northwest of Nahunta, GA. Southern rough and logging slash. Moderate fire activity. Numerous structures remain threatened.

**Airport Road**, Florida DOF. IMT 2 (Utley). IMT also managing Red Oak fire. Three miles southwest of Ormond Beach, FL. Hardwood litter. Running and spotting.

**Surprise**, Arthur R. Marshall/Loxahatchee National Wildlife Refuge, Six miles west of Boyton Beach, FL. Grass. No new information.

**Red Oak**, Florida DOF. IMT 2 (Utley). Two miles southwest of Pine Lakes, FL. Brush and palmetto. Spotting. No further information received.

**HP**, Big Cypress National Preserve. Thirty-five miles southeast of Naples, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire activity. No further information received.

**Smith**, Eastern Cherokee Agency, BIA. Twelve miles northeast of Bryson City, NC. Hardwood litter. No new information.

### **POWER LINE SAFETY**

Operating near or under power lines poses unique hazards, and the following precautions should be followed to reduce potential equipment damage or injury:

- If possible, the power company should deactivate lines in the fire area.
- Don't operate heavy equipment under power lines.
- Don't use right-of-ways as a jump or cargo drop spot.
- Don't drive with long antennas under power lines.
- Don't stand near power lines during retardant drops.
- Don't park under power lines. The magnetic field around energized power lines can induce an electrical charge in ungrounded vehicles or equipment. This charge can shock anyone who touches the vehicle.
- Don't apply straight stream to power lines.
- All personnel should be cautioned that smoke may become charged and conduct the electrical current. Deactivated transmission and distribution lines may continue to pose a hazard due to induction.
- If power lines fall on your vehicle, DON'T leave the vehicle until the power company arrives. If the vehicle is on fire or fire is near, jump clear, don't hang on, keep feet together, and bunny hop away.
