Area Command Team (Zimmerman) is assigned to manage incident prioritization and resource allocation for fires burning in southwest Montana.

Sawmill Complex (4 fires), Lolo NF. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (McNitt) to IMT 2 (Angell) occurring. Twenty-two miles southeast of Missoula, MT. Timber and grass. Active ground fire with group torching and midrange spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Jocko Lakes, Flathead Agency, BIA. IMT 1 (Hoff). Twenty-six miles northeast of Missoula, MT. Timber with dead and down lodgepole pine. Short uphill runs with group tree torching. Structures threatened.

Rattlesnake, Nez Perce NF. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Kusicko) to IMT 2 (Grant) today. Twenty-five miles south of Elk City, ID. Timber and grass. Smoldering, creeping and backing with isolated torching. Communities of Orogrande and Concord, ranches and recreation sites threatened.

Chippy Creek, Northwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (Bennett) to IMT 2 (Secrest) today. Twenty-four miles north of Thompson Falls, MT. Timber, dead and down lodgepole pine with logging slash. Smoldering with occasional torching. Residences threatened.

Rombo Mountain, Bitterroot NF. IMT 1 (Quesinberry). IMT also managing the Rat Creek and Pattengail Creek fires. Eighteen miles south of Darby, MT. Bug-killed timber. Active fire behavior with group tree torching and uphill runs. Structures threatened.

Black Cat, Southwestern Land Office, Montana DNR. IMT 1 (Martin). Started on private land five miles northeast of Frenchtown, MT. Timber. Surface runs with torching. Community of Evaro and Highway 93 threatened.

Rat Creek, Beaverhead/Deerlodge NF. Twenty-five miles west of Wisdom, MT. Timber. Active fire with torching, crown runs and long-range spotting. Structures, historic and cultural sites threatened.

BH, Bitterroot NF. FUMT (Perkins). FUMT also managing Bitterroot Fire Use Complex fire. Thirty-six miles southwest of Darby, MT. Timber. Active surface fire with group tree torching and spotting.

Bitterroot Fire Use Complex (13 fires), Bitterroot NF. Fifteen miles west of Darby, MT. Timber and grass. Active surface fire with group tree torching.

Skyland, Flathead NF. IMT 2 (Heintz). Thirty-two miles east of Kalispell, MT. Timber and grass. Creeping and smoldering with isolated torching. Structures threatened.

Ahorn, Lewis and Clark NF. FUMT (Lineback). FUMT also managing the Fool Creek fire. Thirty miles west of Augusta, MT. Timber. Ground fire with group tree torching and isolated crown runs. Structures threatened.

Fool Creek, Lewis and Clark NF. Thirty miles northwest of Choteau, MT. Timber and snags. Smoldering surface fire with occasional group tree torching.

WH Complex (2 fires), Gallatin NF. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (Stanich) to FUMT (Bonefeld) today. Twenty-seven miles south of Livingston, MT. Timber. Creeping and smoldering with occasional torching.

Bridge, Clearwater NF. Forty-five miles southwest of Missoula, MT. Timber and brush. Short crown runs and isolated group tree torching.

Pattengail Creek, Beaverhead/Deerlodge NF. Ten miles northeast of Wisdom, MT. Timber with dead and down fuels. Active fire behavior with torching and uphill crown runs. Residences threatened.

Conger Creek, Lolo NF. Twenty miles north of Ovando, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with group tree torching and spotting. Structures threatened.

Corporal, Flathead NF. Forty-seven miles southeast of Kalispell, MT. Timber. Active fire with group tree torching and short crown runs. Structures threatened.

Boundary Junction, Clearwater NF. Fifteen miles southeast of Pierce, ID. Timber, brush and grass. Creeping and smoldering with isolated torching.

Poe Cabin, Craig Mountain Area Office, Idaho Department of Lands. Twenty-three miles southwest of Grangeville, ID. Timber and grass. Smoldering.
