41, Merced-Mariposa Unit, Cal Fire. Seventeen miles north of Fresno, CA. Grass and oak woodland. No new information.

Clover - WFU, Sequoia NF. FUMT (Beckman). Thirty-two miles north of Weldon, CA. Timber and brush. Monitor fire.

Humbolt, Butte Unit, Cal Fire. Cal Fire IMT 1 (Wallen). One mile east of Chico, CA. Grass. Extreme fire behavior. Evacuations for communities of Paradise, Butte Valley and Butte Creek Canyon in effect. Road closures in effect. Numerous structures threatened.

Whiskey, Mendocino NF. IMT 2 (Kaage) ordered. Five miles northwest of Paskenta, CA. Chaparral. Moderate rates of spread with spotting. Road closure in effect. Residences threatened.

Martin, San Mateo-Santa Cruz Unit, Cal Fire. Eight miles northwest of Santa Cruz, CA. Ponderosa pine, manzanita and chamise. Group tree torching.

Jackson, Amador-El Dorado Unit, Cal Fire. Five miles south of Rio Oso, CA. Long range spotting. No new information.

Evans Road, North Carolina Division of Forest Resources. IMT 2 (Brandon) and NIMOs (Custer and Whitney). Seven miles south of Creswell, NC. Pocosin, chaparral, and southern rough. Isolated torching, creeping and smoldering in deep organic soils. Numerous structures threatened.

South 1, Great Dismal Swamp NWR. IMT 2 (Wilder). Twelve miles southeast of Suffolk, VA. Logging slash and blow down. Flanking and backing fire with short range spotting.

Goff Creek, Oklahoma DOF. Eleven miles northwest of Guymon, OK. Tall grass. Wind-driven fire with short range spotting. Structures threatened.

Deep Lake, Big Cypress National Preserve, NPS. Ten miles north of Ochopee, FL. Southern rough and grass. Monitor fire.

West Line, Texas Forest Service. Fifty-three miles southeast of Midland, TX. Grass. Minimal fire activity. Residence threatened.

Salt Fork, Texas Forest Service. Fifteen miles northeast of Stonewall, TX. Grass. Moderate fire activity. Structures threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.
