Zimmerman's Area Command Team is providing planning and incident management support to the Shasta-Trinity National Forest. Lohrey's Area Command Team is managing large fire complexes on the Lassen National Forest. Gage's NIMO Team is supporting the ONCC Multi-Agency Coordinating Group.

BTU Lightning Complex (31 fires), Butte Unit, Cal Fire. Cal Fire IMT 1 (Lewin). Twenty-seven miles north of Yuba City, CA. Timber, brush and logging slash. Active fire behavior with occasional crown runs and spotting. Communities of Jarbo Gapa and Concow threatened. Precautionary evacuation advisories have been issued for several communities. Highway 70 closed.

SHU Lightning Complex (70 fires), Shasta-Trinity Unit, Cal Fire. Cal Fire IMT 1 (Kerschen). Shasta and Trinity counties, CA. Timber, brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior. Junction City, Platina, Corman Ranch and power generation system threatened. Evacuation orders in effect for several communities.

Whiskeytown Complex (3 fires), Whiskeytown National Recreation Area, NPS. IMT 2 (McNitt). Twelve miles west of Redding, CA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire activity with backing and upslope runs. Communication towers and power lines threatened.

Lime Complex (48 fires), Shasta-Trinity NF. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Kaage) to IMT 1 (Opliger) occurred. Fourteen miles west of Hayfork, CA. Timber. Short uphill runs with active backing, flanking and spotting. Numerous structures, ranches and youth camps threatened. Communities of Platina and Wildwood evacuated. Hwy 36 closed.

Iron Complex (27 fires), Shasta-Trinity NF. IMT 2 (Swartzlander). IMT 1 (Broyles). One mile north of Junction City, CA. Heavy timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire activity. Communities and lookout threatened. Evacuations in effect. Highway 299 has restricted traffic flow. Reduction in acreage due to transfer of five fires to the Alps Complex.

Alps Complex (15 fires), Shasta-Trinity NF. FUMT (Soper). Confine/contain management strategy. Three miles northeast of Burnt Ranch, CA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior. Residences threatened.

MEU Lightning Complex (107 fires), Mendocino Unit, Cal Fire. Cal Fire IMT 1 (Waterman). Mendocino County, CA. Timber and grass. Moderate to rapid rates of spread with isolated torching and spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Greenfield and Singley threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Canyon Complex (30 fires), Plumas NF. IMT 1 (Pincha-Tulley). Sixteen miles northeast of Paradise, CA. Timber. Moderate rates of spread and isolated torching. Residences and archeological sites threatened. Road closures in effect.

American River Complex (3 fires), Tahoe NF. IMT 1 (Summerfelt). Eleven miles northeast of Foresthill, CA. Timber, brush and chaparral. Active surface fire with short uphill runs and single and group tree torching. Watershed, power lines and private inholdings threatened.

Yuba River Complex (3 fires), Tahoe NF. IMT 2 (Joseph). Thirteen miles northeast of Nevada City, CA. Timber and brush. Backing fire with uphill runs. Several communities, hydroelectric facilities and recreation sites threatened.

Peterson Complex, Lassen NF. Unified command between IMT 1 (Ruggiero) and Cal Fire. Twelve miles east of Cassell, CA. Timber and grass. Creeping, smoldering and spotting. Residences threatened.

Mill Complex, Lassen NF. IMT 1 (Larsen). Sixteen miles northeast of Los Molinos, CA. Timber. No further information received.

Cub Complex (2 fires), Lassen NF. IMT 2 (Batten). Sixteen miles southwest of Chester, CA. Timber. Active backing fire with short uphill runs, isolated torching and spotting. Smoke impacting community of Chester.

Corral, Lassen-Modoc Unit, Cal Fire. Twenty-three miles west of Termo, CA. Timber and grass. Moderate rates of spread with spotting.

Soda Complex (4 fires), Mendocino NF. IMT 2 (Heintz). Fifteen miles northwest of Upper Lake, CA. Chaparral, mixed conifer and oak woodlands. Backing fire with group tree torching. Residences threatened.

Lookouts

Lookouts are often better situated to notice the cumulative changes of fire behavior.

- Fire Order #8 says, "Establish lookouts in potentially hazardous situations." Should you utilize lookouts at all times?
 - Lookouts should be posted at all times.
- What are you looking for when you are selecting a lookout location?
 - Choose a good vantage point, preferably with a good overview of the entire area where firefighters are located, including escape routes and safety zones.
 - Utilize aircraft if they are available, but only as a complement to established lookouts on the ground. Never rely exclusively on aircraft as your lookout.
- What are the desired qualities, capabilities, knowledge, and responsibilities of a lookout person?
 - Experienced firefighter.
 - Solid knowledge of fire behavior and ability to recognized and monitor other environmental hazards.
 - Good communicator--keeps the crew advised of fire behavior changes, tracks weather trends and relays the information, informs crew of work progress and updates from the latest strategy and tactical briefings.
 - Monitors and accounts for all individuals within his/her assigned area at all times, and will notify others if breaks are needed.

What is the necessary equipment for a lookout?

• PPE, radio with extra batteries, compass, binoculars, belt weather kit, IAP, map, food, and water.
