**Gulch**, Shasta-Trinity NF. IMT 2 (Kaage). Three miles west of Platina, CA. Timber and brush. Active fire with occasional short-range spotting. Residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

**Deerhorn,** Hoopa Valley Tribe. One mile southeast of Weitchpec, CA. Timber and grass. Backing fire. Structures threatened.

**Siskiyou/Blue 2 Complex,** Klamath NF. Eighteen miles southwest of Happy Camp, CA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire activity with backing, occasional short uphill runs and single tree torching.

  - ✓ Select the closest, least obstructed route.
  - ✓ Plan for more than one escape route.
  - ✓ Avoid an uphill escape.
  - ✓ Scout and clearly mark the route for visibility (aids during smoky situations or night operational periods).
  - ✓ Determine escape time--consider slowest person, fatigue, and temperature factors.
  - ✓ Continuously reassess the situation with regard to work progress and additional resource arrivals.
  - ✓ Assure all line personnel are familiar with escape routes
