SAFECOM Summaries

The Aviation Safety Communiqué (**SAFECOM**) AMD-34/FS-5700-14 should be used to report any condition, observation, act, maintenance problem, or circumstance with personnel or the aircraft that has the potential to cause an aviation-related mishap. SAFECOMS are a tool used to identify, document, track, and correct aviation safety related issues.

During higher flight activity months, NPS, BLM and the Forest Service will summarize SAFECOMs and identify trends and other learning points. Though searching the SAFECOM website for individual reports are always available as a good source of lessons learned, SAFECOM summaries are a great source of information condensed and easily used as a topic for a safety discussion.
