Predictive Services Discussion: Moisture intrusion into the Great Basin will slowly move east, taking showers and storms with it, with scattered showers and storms also extending along the length of the Rockies and High Plains. A surface frontal boundary running down through the Atlantic coastal states and then along the Gulf coast will be the trigger for showers and storms in the East. The mid-level high centered over the southern Great Plains is extending a ridge north with heat extending up into eastern Montana. A weak shortwave trough moving into the Northwest will drop temperatures in that region.
