Predictive Services Discussion: A strong storm over the West will produce coastal rain and inland snow across the Northwest, northern Rockies and the northern Great Basin. Strong gusty winds will develop over the northern Rockies. A deepening low over the central Rockies will produce critical fire weather conditions from strong winds and low humidity over the southern and central Plains. High pressure over the East will keep fair and mild conditions across the eastern US.

HELICOPTER LANDING AREA SAFETY

The following points should be considered when operating around an unimproved landing site:

- Always wear your personal protective equipment (PPE) when working around an operating helicopter. (Eye, hearing, head)
- Always get the approval of a flight crewmember or the pilot before approaching an operating helicopter.
- Only approach and depart a helicopter as directed, in a slightly crouched position, and in full view of a crewmember. Keep in pilot's field of vision at all times.
- Never go near the tail of helicopters.
- When loading helicopters in uneven terrain, always approach and depart from the down slope (lower) side and do not hold equipment overhead..
- Remove or secure loose articles prior to working around an operating helicopter.
- Be aware of the dust abatement conditions of the landing area, as blowing dust, sand, or rocks caused by the helicopter's rotor wash can be hazardous.
