Bagley, Shasta-Trinity NF. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (Whitcome) to IMT 1 (McGowan) will occur tomorrow. Seven miles west of Big Bend, CA. Timber. Active fire behavior with torching and spotting. Structures and high voltage power lines threatened.

Predictive Services Discussion: Strong winds and low relative humidity will produce critical fire weather conditions across northern California and northern Nevada. Isolated to widely scattered thunderstorms will form over the eastern Great Basin, the Southwest and the central Rockies. In the East, Hurricane Isaac will approach the Louisiana and Mississippi coasts, bringing strong winds, thunderstorms and heavy rain to the Gulf coast region. Mild, dry conditions will continue over much of the Plains, Midwest and New England.

Today's discussion is from the LCES (Lookouts, Communication, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones) Category.



Escape Routes

An escape route is a preplanned and understood route to reach a safety zone.

- What are the primary concerns in choosing an escape route?
- Select the closest, least obstructed route.
 - Plan for more than one escape route.
 - Avoid an uphill escape.
 - Scout and clearly mark the route for visibility (aids during smoky situations or night operational periods). NWCG recommends using hot-pink flagging marked "Escape Route" (NFES 0566). Crews with colorblind members may wish to carry and utilize fluorescent chartreuse flagging (NFES # 2396).
- Determine escape time--consider slowest person, fatigue, and temperature factors.
 - Continuously reassess the situation with regard to work progress and additional resource arrivals.
 - Assure all line personnel are familiar with escape routes.
 - Vehicles parked for escape.
