Predictive Services Discussion: Scattered rain and snow will move across the Northwest and the northern Rockies. Scattered showers will develop across parts of the Colorado Front Range early before weakening in the afternoon. Otherwise, mild conditions will continue across most of the West while deep, cold air will drop through the Plains to southern Texas. A cold front moving through the Mississippi valley will bring scattered showers from the Ohio Valley to the central Gulf. Meanwhile, scattered thunderstorms and increasing northeast winds will affect the Southeast coast from Florida to the Carolinas.
