**Highline**, Tonto, NF. IMT1 (Day). Eight miles north of Payson, AZ. Timber, brush and tall grass. Active fire behavior with group torching, flanking and creeping. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, road, area and trail closures in effect.

**Lizard**, Coronado, NF. IMT 1 (Pierson). Three miles southeast of Dagoon, AZ. Short grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and backing. Area closures in effect.

**Boundary**, Coconino, NF. IMT 2 (Andrews). Twelve miles north of Bellemont, AZ. Timber, short grass and heavy logging slash. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and torching. Structures threatened. Road, area and trail closures in effect.

\* **Flying R**, Coronado, NF. Nine miles southeast of Patagonia, AZ. Short grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Road closures in effect.

**Bonita**, Carson, NF. Sixteen miles northeast of Canjilon, NM. Timber, brush and short grass. Moderate fire behavior with long range spotting, short crown runs and single tree torching. Road and area closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

**Predictive Services Discussion:** Isolated wet storms will return to the interior of Alaska as temperatures remain near normal under a weak ridge of high pressure. Across the southwestern states a hot, dry ridge of high pressure will begin to strengthen and will provide additional drying and curing to fuels. Winds should be overall light and diurnally-driven. A weak cold front will move from the Pacific Northwest into the Northern Rockies spreading scattered showers and wet storms across the mountains and should keep temperatures just below seasonal levels. The Great Plains and the Northeast will remain mostly dry with seasonal temperatures under a weaker westerly flow. In the Southeast, a stalled frontal boundary will continue to produce showers and storms.
