Predictive Services Discussion: Isolated wet storms will return to the interior of Alaska as temperatures remain near normal under a weak ridge of high pressure. Across the southwestern states a hot, dry ridge of high pressure will begin to strengthen and will provide additional drying and curing to fuels. Winds should be overall light and diurnally-driven. A weak cold front will move from the Pacific Northwest into the Northern Rockies spreading scattered showers and wet storms across the mountains and should keep temperatures just below seasonal levels. The Great Plains and the Northeast will remain mostly dry with seasonal temperatures under a weaker westerly flow. In the Southeast, a stalled frontal boundary will continue to produce showers and storms.
