**Predictive Services Discussion:** Breezy and dry conditions will create pockets of critical fire weather conditions across the Columbia Basin in Washington and Oregon while a weak cold front moves east across the Northern Rockies creating scattered wet and dry storms. The convection is expected to extend southward along the Continental Divide becoming all wet entering Colorado and New Mexico. Further west, a very strong area of high pressure will begin to develop over the Southwest and Southern California. The emergence of this high pressure will mark the beginning of an extended very hot and dry spell for the entire west that will begin mid-week. Looking north to Alaska, warm and dry conditions will continue across the interior along with a chance for mainly afternoon storms over the Brooks and Alaska Ranges.
