<u>Predictive Services Discussion:</u> A dry northeasterly flow will continue over California as the upper level ridge moves inland and as a weak thermal trough begins to develop along the cast. With the weakening upper level trough continuing to slowly move east and over the Continental Divide, surface high pressure over Nevada and Utah will elevate the potential for Santa Ana wind possibilities across Southern California. However, should the event occur, it is not expected to be a major or long lasting one. Looking east, scattered showers and storms will impact Texas and should provide needed moisture to the state's interior. Dry conditions are expected along the East Coast along with warmer than normal temperatures as Hurricane Maria moves north several hundred miles off the Delaware coast,

HELICOPTER LANDING AREA SAFETY

Aviation Category

The following points should be considered when operating around an unimproved landing site:

- Always wear your personal protective equipment (PPE) when working around an operating helicopter. (Eye, hearing, head)
- Always get the approval of a flight crewmember or the pilot before approaching an operating helicopter.
- Only approach and depart a helicopter as directed, in a slightly crouched position, and in full view of a crewmember. Keep in pilot's field of vision at all times.
- Never go near the tail of helicopters.
- When loading helicopters in uneven terrain, always approach and depart from the down slope (lower) side and do not hold equipment overhead.
- Remove or secure loose articles prior to working around an operating helicopter.
- Be aware of the dust abatement conditions of the landing area, as blowing dust, sand, or rocks caused by the helicopter's rotor wash can be hazardous.
