Predictive Services Discussion: The persistent trough along the West Coast will weaken and begin to move inland. Scattered showers will increase across the Northwest and Northern Rockies. Elsewhere across the West, dry weather will prevail except for isolated showers or thunderstorms over the central Rockies. Breezy to locally windy conditions will continue over the Interior West. In the East, inland flooding will remain possible across the Carolinas and Virginia as the remnants of Hurricane Florence continue to move slowly westward, producing heavy rainfall over the Piedmont and the Blue Mountains.

Burn Protocols

Firefighter Health & First Aid

Burn injuries are often difficult to diagnose and may continue to worsen if they do not receive immediate, specialized treatment. The initial evaluation and treatment of these burns often happens in rural medical facilities with limited experience in burn injury care. In the past, this has resulted in evaluation and treatment that did not provide the best care to injured firefighters. Therefore, victims with either severe burns or burns that meet any of the below criteria should be immediately referred and transported to a regional burn center.

- Burn injury criteria identified by the American Burn Association as warranting immediate referral to an accredited burn center.
 - Partial thickness burns (second degree) involving greater than 5% Total Body Surface Area.
 - Burns involving the face, hands, feet, genitalia, perineum, or major joints.
 - Third degree burns of any size.
 - Electrical burns, including lightning injury.
 - Inhalation injury suspected.
 - Burns accompanied by traumatic injury (such as fractures).
 - Individuals unable to immediately return to full duty.
- It is imperative that action is expeditious, as burn injuries are often difficult to evaluate and may take 72 hours to manifest themselves. When there is any doubt as to the severity of the injury, the required action is to immediately refer and transport the employee to a regional burn center.
- To ensure Workers Compensation assistance, an agency administrator or designee for the incident needs to coordinate with the firefighter's home unit.
