\* **Wild Horse Creek**, Osage Agency, BIA. Six miles southeast of Hominy, OK. Tall grass and hardwood litter. Extreme fire behavior with spotting and torching. Structures threatened.

\* **Bville Casino**, Osage Agency, BIA. Four miles southwest of Bartlesville, OK. Tall grass and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with smoldering. Structures threatened.

\* **Penn Creek**, Osage Agency, BIA. Two miles west of Hominy, OK. Tall grass. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, spotting and long-range spotting. Structures threatened.

\* **Radar**, Oklahoma DOF. One mile west of Bartlesville, OK. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened.

\* **King Hollow**, Northeast Area, Oklahoma DOF. Ten miles northeast of Locust Grove, OK. Timber and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs.

\* **Turkey**, East Central Area, Oklahoma DOF. Nine miles southeast of Blanco, OK. Timber. Active fire behavior with running.

\* **Whispering Pines**, Cherokee Nation Tribe, BIA. Four miles east of Kenwood, OK. Hardwood litter and tall grass. Extreme fire behavior. Structures threatened.

\* **Bowens**, Daniel Boone NF. Three miles east of Roark, KY. Hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping.

\* **Crow Hollow**, Northeast Area, Oklahoma DOF. Ten miles east of Tahequah, OK. Timber. Active fire behavior.

**Dues**, Osage Agency, BIA. One mile northeast of Cleveland, OK. Timber, brush and short grass. No new information. Last report unless new information is received.

**CR 2297 Allentown (03)**, Florida Forest Service. Eight miles southeast of Callaway, FL. Timber and southern rough. No new information.

**Tayole**, Okmulgee Field Office, BIA. Six miles south of Bristow, OK. Hardwood litter. No new information. Last report unless new information is received.

**Czar Coal**, Kentucky DOF. Ten miles south of Inez, KY. Timber and tall grass. No new information.

**Predictive Services Discussion:** The late season snowstorm over the Upper Midwest will begin to pull off into Canada by Friday afternoon. Another weaker system will move southeast from the Great Basin into the Southwest bringing scattered showers and storms to the Four Corners Friday. As the system moves into the southern Great Plains on Saturday, it will strengthen and bring in some colder air. Some parts of the northern Texas Panhandle, Oklahoma Panhandle, and southwestern Kansas could see some very late season snowfall. A strong cold front will develop over East Texas and will move east across the mid-South bringing severe thunderstorms Saturday afternoon and Saturday night. A breezy westerly flow will develop over the West Sunday as the next system arrives in the Pacific Northwest and moves east along the Canadian border. The active pattern will continue through mid-week as a few more systems follow in its wake. Additional mountain snowpack accrual is expected and could decrease snowpack deficits that exist along the Canadian border. A warming and drying trend may begin Thursday along the West coast as a high pressure ridge off shore strengthens and drifts east. In Alaska, a weak trough will linger over the Interior and keep periodically showery conditions going through the week. Temperatures will be near normal.

## **SAFECOMs**

*Aviation Category*

### **What the SAFECOM system IS**

The Aviation Safety Communiqué (SAFECOM) [AMD-34/FS-5700-14](#) should be used to report any condition, observation, act, maintenance problem, or circumstance with personnel or the aircraft that has the potential to cause an aviation-related mishap. SAFECOMs are a tool used to identify, document, track, and correct safety related issues.

### **What the SAFECOM system IS NOT**

- NOT intended for initiating punitive actions,
- NOT to be used as a complaint system or for personal attacks,
- NOT used by contracting officers for contract evaluations/award purposes,
- NOT a substitute for "on-the-spot" corrections to a safety concern, and
- Does NOT replace the requirement for initiating an accident or incident report.

### **SAFECOMs provide the necessary feedback for development of the following communication tools:**

- *Accident Prevention Bulletins*
- *Lessons Learned*
- *Safety Alerts*
- *Technical Bulletins*
- *Airwards*
- *Information sharing Memos*
- *Maintenance deficiencies (ADs, SBs, etc)*
- *Safety trends*
- *Training needs*
