NIMO (Houseman) has been assigned to COVID-19 support at Forest Service headquarters in Washington, D.C.

NIMO (Reinarz) has been assigned to provide wildland fire support to California.

NIMO (Day) has been assigned to provide wildland fire support to federal land management agencies in Oregon and Washington.

Two hundred thirty-four Marines from the 7th Engineer Support Battalion, 1st Marine Logistics Group, 1 Marine Expeditionary Force based out of Camp Pendleton, California are deployed in support of the Creek fire.

One RC-26 aircraft with Distributed Real-Time Infrared (DRTI) capability and support personnel from the 141st Air Refueling Wing (Washington Air National Guard) has been deployed to Fairchild AFB (Spokane, WA), in support of wildland fire operations.

Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel from the 146th Airlift Wing (California Air National Guard) and one MAFFS C-130 airtanker and support personnel from each the 153rd Airlift Wing (Wyoming Air National Guard) and the 152nd Airlift Wing (Nevada Air National Guard) have been deployed to support wildland fire operations in California.

Eight fire suppression crews and four overhead personnel from Canada are supporting fire suppression efforts in northern California.

Seven fire suppression crews, 18 fire engines and 54 overhead personnel from Canada are supporting fire suppression efforts in Oregon.

Five fire suppression crews and four overhead personnel from Mexico are supporting fire suppression efforts in southern California.

Glass, Sonoma-Lake Napa Unit, Cal Fire. IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 3). Thirteen miles northwest of Napa, CA. Tall grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and short-range spotting. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

North Complex, Plumas NF, USFS. IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 4) and IMT 2 (RM Team Black). IMT 1 (CA Team 4) mobilizing. One mile southwest of Crescent Mills, CA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with creeping and torching. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

August Complex (2 fires), Mendocino NF, USFS. Area Command Team (Jalbert) and IMT 1 (AK Team 1). Transfer of command from NIMO (Quesinberry) to IMT 1 (PNW Team 2) will occur today. Fourteen miles northwest of Elk Creek, CA. Timber, chaparral and tall grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and flanking. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

August Complex West Zone, Mendocino Unit, Cal Fire. IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 5). Four miles northeast of Covelo, CA. Timber, chaparral and tall grass. Active fire behavior with flanking, spotting and backing. Several communities and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Zogg, Shasta-Trinity Unit, Cal Fire. IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 2). Nine miles southwest of Redding, CA. Chaparral, brush and short grass. Active fire behavior with backing, uphill runs and smoldering. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Red Salmon Complex (2 fires), Six Rivers NF, USFS. IMT 2 (NW Team 10). Fourteen miles northeast of Willow Creek, CA. Timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, running and short-range spotting. Several communities and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Slater, Klamath NF, USFS. Transfer of command from IMT 1(NR Team 2) to IMT 2 (NW Team 7) will occur on 10/3. IMT is also managing the Devil fire. Five miles northeast of Happy Camp, CA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, isolated torching and flanking. Several communities and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Devil, Klamath NF, USFS. Five miles north of Seiad, CA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and isolated torching. Area and trail closures in effect.

Fork, Eldorado NF, USFS. Fifteen miles northeast of Pollock Pines, CA. Timber and brush. No new information.

Area Command Team (Sexton) has been mobilized to support wildland fire in southern California.

SQF Complex (2 fires), Sequoia NF, USFS. IMT 1 (CA Team 2) and IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 6). Thirty-three miles east of Porterville, CA. Timber and chaparral. Active fire behavior with group torching and short-range spotting. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Creek, Sierra NF, USFS. IMT 1 (CA Team 5) and IMT 2 (NR Team 4). Thirty-five miles northeast of Clovis, CA. Timber, chaparral and tall grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, torching and creeping. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bobcat, Angeles NF, USFS. IMT 2 (CA Team 11). Twelve miles northeast of Pasadena, CA. Chaparral, brush and tall grass. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Dolan, Los Padres NF, USFS. IMT 2 (CA Team 15). Ten miles south of Big Sur, CA. Brush, chaparral and short grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, uphill runs and single tree torching. Several communities and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

El Dorado, San Bernardino Unit, Cal Fire. Three miles northeast of Yucaipa, CA. Timber, chaparral and brush. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and backing. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Moraine, Sequoia & Kings Canyon NP, NPS. Five miles northeast of Kanawyers, CA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Lionshead, Warm Springs Agency, BIA. IMT 2 (NW Team 13). Twenty miles west of Warm Springs, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Several communities threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

OR-WIF-200430, Willamette NF, USFS. IMT 1 (ODF Team 1). Thirty-five miles east of Eugene, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Road, area and trail closures in effect.

Archie Creek, Umpqua NF, USFS. IMT 1 (SA Red Team). IMT is also managing the Thielsen fire. Twenty miles east of Glide, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Thielsen, Umpqua NF, USFS. Sixteen miles west of Chemult, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

S. Obenchain, Medford Unit, Oregon DOF. Five miles east of Eagle Point, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Brattain, Fremont-Winema NF, USFS. Eight miles south of Paisley, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Sage-grouse habitat threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Two Four Two, Fremont-Winema NF, USFS. Six miles northeast of Chiloquin, OR. Timber, brush and tall grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

White River, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Twenty miles west of Wamic, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Beachie Creek, Willamette NF, USFS. IMT 1 (PNW Team 3). IMT is also managing the Riverside fire. Six miles north of Detroit, OR. Timber and brush. No new information.

Riverside, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. One mile southeast of Estacada, OR. Closed timber litter. No new information.

Cold Creek, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Thirty-eight miles west of Yakima, WA. Timber and hardwood litter. No new information.

Williams Fork, Arapaho and Roosevelt NF and Pawnee National Grassland, USFS. IMT 2 (NR Team 6) mobilizing. Fifteen miles southwest of Fraser, CO. Timber. Active fire behavior with spotting, group torching and short crown runs. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Gibbons, Pine Ridge Agency, BIA. Fifteen miles north of Pine Ridge, SD. Timber and tall grass. Extreme fire behavior. Residences threatened.

Predictive Services Discussion: A broad upper ridge over the West will continue to yield hot, dry, and unstable conditions for California, the Desert Southwest, and the Great Basin. Fires actively burning in California will be challenged by significant heat and very low relative humidities. Additionally, winds around the North Bay area and along the Central Coast are expected to be breezy, yielding favorable conditions for rapid fire spread. Another cold front is forecast to move across the Northern Great Plains, continuing the trend of dry, gusty conditions for the region. No precipitation is likely west of the Mississippi River.

Extended Attack

Operational Engagement Category

After your initial size-up of the fire and/or transfer of command from an initial attack Incident Commander, answer the following questions. Repeat this analysis whenever there is a change, or predicted change, in fire conditions.

- Do you have a current fire weather forecast for the fire location?
- Is the observed fire weather consistent with the forecast?
- Have you established a new organizational structure and communicated it to the other forces associated with the fire?
- Can you control the fire with the resources available (either on the incident or soon to be on the incident) under expected conditions?
- Have you developed a plan to attack the fire?
 - Direct or indirect
 - Anchor points
 - Escape routes
 - Head or flank attack
 - Priority areas
- Have you communicated this to all personnel assigned to the incident, including new arrivals?
- Can you see all of the fire area?
- Can you communicate with everyone on the fire and with dispatch?
- Are escape routes established?
 - If you are using the black, is it completely burned and without a reburn potential?
- Are safety and the standard fire orders being followed and/or mitigated?
- Will you contain the fire before the next operational period?
- Have you reported the status of the fire to dispatch?
- Do you have a complete list of what resources have been ordered for the fire?
