NIMO (Houseman) has been assigned to COVID-19 support at Forest Service headquarters in Washington, D.C.

NIMO (Reinarz) has been assigned to provide wildland fire support to California.

Two hundred thirty-four Marines from the 7<sup>th</sup> Engineer Support Battalion, 1<sup>st</sup> Marine Logistics Group, 1 Marine Expeditionary Force based out of Camp Pendleton, California are deployed in support of the Creek fire.

Eleven fire suppression crews and five overhead personnel from Canada are supporting fire suppression efforts in northern California.

Six fire suppression crews, 15 fire engines and 14 overhead personnel from Canada are supporting fire suppression efforts in Oregon.

Five fire suppression crews and four overhead personnel from Mexico are supporting fire suppression efforts in southern California.

**Glass**, Sonoma-Lake Napa Unit, Cal Fire. IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 3). Thirteen miles northwest of Napa, CA. Tall grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, creeping and smoldering. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**August Complex** (2 fires), Mendocino NF, USFS. Area Command Team (Sexton), IMT 1 (AK Team 1) and IMT 1 (PNW Team 2), IMT 1 (SW Team 1) and IMT 1 (GB Team 2). Fourteen miles northwest of Elk Creek, CA. Timber, chaparral and tall grass. Active fire behavior with group torching, short-range spotting and backing. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**August Complex West Zone**, Mendocino Unit, Cal Fire. IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 5). Four miles northeast of Covelo, CA. Timber, chaparral and tall grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, backing and isolated torching. Several communities and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**North Complex**, Plumas NF, USFS. IMT 1 (CA Team 4). One mile southwest of Crescent Mills, CA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, creeping and isolated torching. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Red Salmon Complex** (2 fires), Six Rivers NF, USFS. IMT 2 (NW Team 10). Fourteen miles northeast of Willow Creek, CA. Timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, running and short-range spotting. Several communities and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Slater**, Klamath NF, USFS. IMT 2 (NW Team 7). IMT is also managing the Devil fire. Five miles northeast of Happy Camp, CA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and isolated torching. Several communities and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Devil**, Klamath NF, USFS. Five miles north of Seiad, CA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and isolated torching. Area and trail closures in effect.

**Zogg**, Shasta-Trinity Unit, Cal Fire. IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 2). Nine miles southwest of Redding, CA. Chaparral, brush and short grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Fork**, Eldorado NF, USFS. Fifteen miles northeast of Pollock Pines, CA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Creek**, Sierra NF, USFS. IMT 1 (CA Team 5) and IMT 2 (NR Team 4). IMT 2 (CA Team 14) mobilizing. Thirty-five miles northeast of Clovis, CA. Timber, chaparral and tall grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, short crown runs and short-range spotting. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**SQF Complex** (2 fires), Sequoia NF, USFS. IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 6). Transfer of command from IMT 1 (CA Team 2) to IMT 2 (CA Team 13) will occur today. Thirty-three miles east of Porterville, CA. Timber and chaparral. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and spotting. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Bobcat**, Angeles NF, USFS. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (CA Team 11) back to the local unit will occur today. Twelve miles northeast of Pasadena, CA. Chaparral, brush and tall grass. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Dolan**, Los Padres NF, USFS. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (CA Team 15) back to the local unit will occur today. Ten miles south of Big Sur, CA. Brush, chaparral and short grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Several communities threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**El Dorado**, San Bernardino Unit, Cal Fire. Three miles northeast of Yucaipa, CA. Timber, chaparral and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

**Moraine**, Sequoia & Kings Canyon NP, NPS. Five miles northeast of Kanawyers, CA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering.

**Mullen**, Medicine Bow-Routt NF and Thunder Basin National Grassland, USFS. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (RM Team Blue) to IMT 1 (SA Blue Team) will occur today. Thirty-eight miles west of Laramie, WY. Timber. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, torching and spotting. Several communities and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Cameron Peak**, Arapaho and Roosevelt NF and Pawnee National Grassland, USFS. IMT 2 (NW Team 6). Fifteen miles southwest of Redfeather Lakes, CO. Timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, long-range spotting and group torching. Several communities threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Williams Fork**, Arapaho and Roosevelt NF and Pawnee National Grassland, USFS. IMT 2 (NR Team 6). Fifteen miles southwest of Fraser, CO. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking and torching. Several communities and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations have been lifted. area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Middle Fork**, Medicine Bow-Routt NF and Thunder Basin National Grassland, USFS. Ten miles north of Steamboat Springs, CO. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with torching and flanking. Structures threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

**Beachie Creek**, Willamette NF, USFS. IMT 1 (PNW Team 3). IMT 2 (NW Team 8) mobilizing. IMT is also managing the Riverside fire. Six miles north of Detroit, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, flanking and creeping. Numerous structures and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Riverside**, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. One mile southeast of Estacada, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with flanking, creeping and smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Lionshead**, Warm Springs Agency, BIA. IMT 2 (NW Team 13). Twenty miles west of Warm Springs, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Several communities threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Predictive Services Discussion:** Cold fronts will push southeast through the Great Basin and Great Plains, respectively. Dry and breezy post-frontal conditions will continue across portions of the High Plains and into southern Wyoming and northern Colorado. Thunderstorms remain likely over the Florida Peninsula with scattered showers in the Great Lakes and Northeast. Sporadic cloud cover will accompany onshore flow in southern and central California as a weak upper low moves onshore.

## EXTREME FIRE BEHAVIOR 1

*Weather / Fire Behavior Category*

Mild, moderate, and EXTREME fire behavior has always been present in cases of shelter deployment. It is critical for firefighters to maintain situational awareness of live and dead fuel moisture conditions, as well as predicted and current weather conditions. As fire behavior changes, it is critical to act decisively in regard to the changing situation.

Discuss the following indicators of extreme fire behavior:

- Relative humidity less than 15%.
- 1-hour fuel moisture less than 5%.
- Transition from surface to crown fire.
- Smoldering fires that exist in the early part of the day are beginning to burn very actively as the day progresses.
- Approaching thunderheads with dark clouds beneath.
- Presence of dust devils indicating an unstable atmosphere.
- Increased spotting.
- Sudden calm.
- High clouds moving fast in direction different from surface wind.
- Predicted Haines Index of 5 and 6 in those areas where this level is a good indicator of atmospheric instability.
- Fire whirls.
