

<u>Predictive Services Discussion:</u> Temperatures will warm to above average across much of the West, especially over the West Coast, as an upper-level ridge builds over the region. Very low relative humidity will accompany these conditions with breezy winds overlapping some of these dry conditions. Rain and potentially heavy rain will continue to spread northeast from central Texas through the Ohio and Tennessee Valleys into the Mid-Atlantic and Northeast. Precipitation is likely across portions of the Alaska Interior and Panhandle.
