Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel each from the $152^{\text {nd }}$ Airlift Wing (Nevada Air National Guard), two MAFFS from the 302 nd Airlift Wing (Colorado Air Force Reserve), two MAFFS from the 153rd Airlift Wing (Wyoming Air National Guard) and two from the $146^{\text {th }}$ Airlift Wing (California Air National Guard) have been deployed to McClellan, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally.

One RC-26 aircraft with Distributed Real-Time Infrared (DRTI) capability and support personnel from the $141^{\text {st }}$ Air Refueling Wing (Washington Air National Guard) have been deployed to Fairchild, WA. One RC-26 aircraft with Distributed Real-Time Infrared (DRTI) capability and support personnel from the $162^{\text {nd }}$ Operations Group (Arizona Air National Guard) have been deployed to Eugene, OR in support of wildland fire operations. Also supporting these aircraft are eight ground controllers from multiple U.S. Air National Guard squadrons.

One Boeing 737 airtanker from New South Wales, Australia is supporting fire suppression efforts in the western United States.

Caldor, Eldorado NF, USFS. Unified command between IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 6) and NIMO (Team 2). Sixteen miles northeast of Plymouth, CA. Timber, light slash and brush. Active fire behavior with long-range spotting, torching and crowning. Several communities, numerous structures and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Dixie, Butte Unit, Cal Fire. Unified command between IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 3) and IMT 1 (CA Team 1). IMT 1 (GB Team 1) and IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 1) mobilizing. Fifteen miles northeast of Paradise, CA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, group torching and short-range spotting. Several communities, numerous structures and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Monument, Shasta-Trinity NF, USFS. Unified command between IMT 1 (Cal Fire Team 5) and IMT 1 (AK Team 1). One mile southwest of Del Loma, CA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with group torching, flanking and backing. Several communities, numerous structures and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

McFarland, Shasta-Trinity NF, USFS. IMT 2 (CA Team 10). IMT 2 (CA Team 11) mobilizing. Four miles southeast of Wildwood, CA. Timber, chaparral and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, creeping and backing. Several communities, numerous structures and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Antelope, Klamath NF, USFS. IMT 1 (SA Red Team). Twenty miles northeast of McCloud, CA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with torching, short-range spotting and uphill runs. Several communities and numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

River Complex (3 fires), Klamath NF, USFS. NIMO (Team 3) and IMT 2 (CA Team 15). IMT 2 (CA Team 13) mobilizing. Nine miles southwest of Etna, CA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, uphill runs and short-range spotting. Several communities, numerous structures and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

McCash, Six Rivers NF, USFS. IMT 2 (GB Team 3). Fourteen miles northeast of Somes Bar, CA. Timber, brush and short grass. Active fire behavior with flanking, torching and running. Several communities, numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Area Command (Team 3) has been mobilized to support the Northwest Multi-Agency Coordinating Group.
Twenty-five Mile, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. IMT 1 (SW Team 1). Twelve miles northwest of Chelan, WA. Short grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, torching and smoldering. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Devil's Knob Complex (3 fires), Umpqua NF, USFS. IMT 1 (Florida Forest Service Red Team). Twenty miles northeast of Azalea, OR. Timber and medium slash. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, short crown runs and group torching. Community of Ash Valley and structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Middle Fork Complex (2 fires), Willamette NF, USFS. IMT 2 (NW Team 13). Nine miles northeast of Oakridge, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and torching. Communities of Oakridge and Westfir and numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Schneider Springs, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. IMT 1 (PNW Team 2). Eighteen miles northwest of Naches, WA. Short grass, timber and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and isolated torching. Communities of Nile and Cliffdell, numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened.
Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Rough Patch Complex (4 fires), Umpqua NF, USFS. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (GB Team 2) to IMT 1 (NR Team 1) will occur tomorrow. IMT is also managing the Jack incident. Eighteen miles southwest of Oakridge, OR. Closed timber litter and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, torching and flanking. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Jack, Umpqua NF, USFS. Thirty-one miles east of Roseburg, OR. Closed timber litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching, backing and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Ford Corkscrew, Northeast Region, DNR. IMT 2 (SW Team 5). Eleven miles south of Springdale, WA. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, torching and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Chickadee Creek, Northeast Region, DNR. IMT 2 (NW Team 12). IMT is also managing the Walker Creek incident. Sixteen miles northwest of Tonasket, WA. Timber and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching.

Walker Creek, Northeast Region, DNR. Four miles northwest of Wauconda, WA. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and isolated torching. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Summit Trail, Colville Agency, BIA. IMT 2 (NW Team 7). IMT is also managing the Mack Mountain and Bulldog Mountain incidents. Seventeen miles west of Inchelium, WA. Timber and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and isolated torching. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Mack Mountain, Colville NF, USFS. Fifteen miles north of Kettle Falls, WA. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area and road closures in effect.

Bulldog Mountain, Colville NF, USFS. Sixteen miles northwest of Kettle Falls, WA. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area and road closures in effect.

Muckamuck, Colville NF, USFS. IMT 2 (NW Team 9). IMT is also managing the Cedar Creek, Cub Creek 2 and Delancy incidents. Four miles northwest of Conconully, WA. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, short-range spotting and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Cedar Creek, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Fifteen miles northwest of Winthrop, WA. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, short-range spotting and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Cub Creek 2, Southeast Region, DNR. Five miles north of Winthrop, WA. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, short-range spotting and smoldering. Several communities and infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Delancy, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Fifteen miles northwest of Winthrop, WA. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bull Complex, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. IMT 2 (GB Team 4). Twenty-five miles northeast of Mill City, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with backing, torching and short-range spotting. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Fox Complex (2 fires), Fremont-Winema NF, USFS. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (ODF Team 3) to the local unit will occur tomorrow. Fourteen miles west of Lakeview, OR. Timber, short grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures and infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Green Ridge, Umatilla NF, USFS. IMT 2 (NW Team 8). Thirty miles east of Walla Walla, WA. Short grass, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion: An upper-level trough will move over the Northern Rockies and onto the northern Plains with weak upper-level ridging expanding over the West Coast from the northeast Pacific late today. A cold front will push south across the High Plains and Wyoming before stalling in central Nevada and northern Utah. Temperatures will remain below normal across the northern half of the West with above normal temperatures in the Desert Southwest and California. Dry and breezy conditions are likely across southern Idaho into portions of Nevada and Utah east into Wyoming and western Colorado. North to northeast winds are expected across southwest Oregon, and northern California today and tonight with the strongest winds over northern California. Very low daytime relative humidity is expected across much of the Great Basin into noncoastal California with poor overnight recovery. Showers and thunderstorms are forecast to spread across much of the northern Plains and Great Lakes with heavy rain possible in portions of the northern Great Lakes. Isolated monsoonal thunderstorms are likely from eastern Arizona into New Mexico and the southern Colorado Rockies.

The 10 Standard Firefighting Orders
Operational Engagement Category

The orders are arranged according to their importance and grouped in a logical sequence: fire behavior, fireline safety, and organizational control.

Review and consider Standard Firefighting Orders as a part of every shift.

- Did you receive or request an adequate briefing, including weather, current and predicted fire behavior, wind direction, predicted humidity, fuel moisture, and/or local factors?
- Do you have a map of the fire? Are topography, fuel types, and spread direction defined?

The Fire Behavior group addresses conditions the firefighter will encounter - weather, fire status, and fire behavior.

1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions and forecasts.
2. Know what your fire is doing at all times.
3. Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire.

- Are you familiar with direction, distance, location, and size of escape routes and safety zones?
- Discuss the need for a lookout, such as extreme fire behavior or a fire located out of your line-of-sight.
- Discuss the importance of situational awareness.

The Fireline Safety group emphasizes personal safety.
4. Identify escape routes and safety zones, and make them known.
5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger.
6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.

- Review the importance and means of sharing tactical decisions and resource movement.
- Review other factors influencing potential changes in tactics, which could affect control of your forces.

The Organizational Control group is centered around tactical decisions.
7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor, and adjoining forces.
8. Give clear instructions and be sure they are understood.
9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.

After you have considered, discussed, and acted on the previous nine orders:
10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.
