Two hundred twenty-five soldiers from the 23rd Brigade Engineer Battalion and 2-3 Infantry Battalion based out of Joint Base Lewis-McChord are deployed in support of the Dixie Fire.

One MAFFS C-130 airtanker and support personnel each from the 152nd Airlift Wing (Nevada Air National Guard), three MAFFS from the 302nd Airlift Wing (Colorado Air Force Reserve), two MAFFS from the 153rd Airlift Wing (Wyoming Air National Guard) and two from the 146th Airlift Wing (California Air National Guard) have been deployed to McClellan, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally.

One RC-26 aircraft with Distributed Real-Time Infrared (DRTI) capability and support personnel from the 141st Air Refueling Wing (Washington Air National Guard) and one RC-26 aircraft with Distributed Real-Time Infrared (DRTI) capability and support personnel from the 162nd Operations Group (Arizona Air National Guard) have been deployed to Sacramento, CA in support of wildland fire operations. Also supporting these aircraft are eight ground controllers from multiple U.S. Air National Guard squadrons.

One Boeing 737 airtanker from New South Wales, Australia is supporting fire suppression efforts in the western United States.

Two fire suppression crews from Quebec, Canada are supporting fire suppression efforts in Washington State.

Predictive Services Discussion: A strong upper-level trough will move into the Northwest tomorrow with a weak upper low just off the southern California coast that will move inland tonight. Ridging will strengthen ahead of the trough over the Southwest, with ridging extending north and east through into the Great Lakes and Northeast. A strong Pacific cold front will move into the Northwest. Elevated to critical fire weather conditions are expected across much Intermountain West into the adjacent northern and central Plains. The strongest winds are forecast to occur in portions of the Great Basin, Montana, and Wyoming. Rain, heavy at times, is forecast for western Washington into northwest Oregon during the day. Rain will spread into the Oregon Cascades and eastern Washington overnight. Isolated to scattered thunderstorms are possible over Arizona into southeast California, far southern Nevada, and southwest Utah as moisture gets drawn northward from Mexico. Rain will continue across the Southeast associated with the remnants of Nicholas.

Constructing Line Without A Safe Anchor Point

Operational Engagement Category

When deciding where to build fireline, the following considerations must be weighed:

- Can you hold the line? How do you do so and ensure your safety if there is a danger of the fire hooking under/around you?
- Are there adequate safety zones and escape routes? Review what constitutes an adequate safety zone and escape route. Who has the responsibility to designate them and monitor their continued suitability?
- Can you develop your starting point into an anchor point? List some effective anchor points. Describe how you would develop your starting point into an anchor point.
- Have you posted lookouts? Where should they be posted? Can they see the main fire? Describe the qualities of a skilled lookout?
- Do you have effective communications? Who do you need to be in contact with? If there are problems with communications, what can you do to improve them?
- To reduce risk, evaluate several locations before making a decision. Talk about fires where you have had to relocate the line because your anchor point did not hold the fire.
- How have you mitigated Watch Out Situation #8 in the past?
