Cedar Creek, Willamette NF, USFS. IMT 2 (NW Team 7). Transfer of command from IMT 1 (PNW Team 3) to IMT 2 (NW Team 9) will occur today. Fifteen miles east of Oakridge, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Double Creek, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. IMT 1 (SA Blue Team). IMT is also managing the Sturgill, Nebo, and Goat Mountain Two fires. Ten miles southeast of Imnaha, OR. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and single tree torching. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sturgill, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Fifteen miles southwest of Enterprise, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Nebo, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Twenty-one miles southeast of Enterprise, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Goat Mountain Two, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Nine miles south of Lostine, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and backing.

Goat Rocks, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Eight miles east of Packwood, WA. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, creeping and torching. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Boulder Mountain, Northeast Region, DNR. Transfer of command from IMT 2 (NW Team 13) back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. Nine miles northwest of Cusick, WA. Timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with backing and creeping. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Rum Creek, Medford District, BLM. Twelve miles northwest of Hugo, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

White River, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Includes acreage from the previously reported Irving Peak fire. Twenty-three miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Minnow Ridge, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles north of Leavenworth, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and isolated torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kalama, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Six miles north of Cougar, WA. Timber and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bolt Creek, Northwest Region, DNR. Previously reported incident. Two miles north of Skykomish, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

Predictive Services Discussion: Upper ridging will remain over the West today with temperatures 10-15oF above normal with minimum relative humidity of 6-25%, but winds will remain light. A cold front will move off the Gulf and East Coasts today with locally breezy winds and very dry conditions behind the front. North to northwest post-frontal winds of 10-15 mph with gusts up to 25 mph will develop from the Mid and Lower Mississippi Valleys eastward to Virginia, the Carolinas, and Georgia. Afternoon relative humidity will drop to 12-30%, lowest in the Mid-Mississippi to Tennessee Valleys. Widespread showers with isolated thunderstorms are expected across the Great Lakes and Northeast. Scattered thunderstorms will develop over the Florida Peninsula this afternoon and westward along the immediate Gulf Coast into Texas. Isolated wet thunderstorms are likely over the higher terrain of New Mexico and eastern Arizona as well.

Aviation Mishap Response Aviation Category

It is critical to respond quickly and effectively to aviation mishaps. A posted and accessible written mishap response action plan is an important first step. A checklist of actions will ensure that nothing is missed in a stressful, time-critical period. All crew members must know where to find the plan and must understand how to use it in an emergency.

- Immediate, positive action is necessary. Any delay may affect someone's chances of survival.
- Conduct rescue operations with the following priorities in mind:
 - Preserve life. Ensure the safety of all rescuers as you respond to assist any victims.
 - Do whatever is necessary to extricate injured occupants and to extinguish fires, keeping in mind the necessity of protecting and preserving evidence.
 - Document and/or photograph the location of any debris that must be disturbed in order to carry out rescues and/or fire suppression activities.
 - Secure the area. Treat the crash site as a crime scene. Arrange for security at the accident scene if necessary. Determine if hazardous materials were on the aircraft. Deny access except to credentialed officials and escorted media.
- Be aware that crash sites can be dangerous due to hazardous cargo, flammable and toxic fluids, sharp objects, disease, adverse terrain, hot/cold weather conditions, and fire.
- Exercise good judgment, utilize available protective devices and clothing, and use extreme caution when working near the wreckage site.
- Do not exceed your physical limitations.

Activity: Review your unit's mishap response plan with the crew. Consider practicing with a crash rescue drill or scenario.
