Minimal fire behavior with creeping, single tree torching and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Double Creek**, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Ten miles southeast of Imnaha, OR. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Goat Rocks**, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Eight miles east of Packwood, WA. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**White River**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and isolated torching. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Kalama**, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Six miles north of Cougar, WA. Timber and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Bolt Creek**, Northwest Region, DNR. Previously reported incident. Two miles north of Skykomish, WA. Timber and hardwood litter. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and flanking. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

**Predictive Services Discussion:** A cold front will push south across the central and southern Plains and from the southern Great Lakes into the Ohio Valley. Low relative humidity of 15-30% will continue from eastern Kansas into east Texas and from the Ohio Valley to the Gulf Coast. Northwest winds of 10-15 mph will also develop across the Mid to Lower Mississippi Valley, with locally elevated conditions. Warm and dry conditions with light winds will continue in California, the western and northern Great Basin, and Inland Northwest. Thunderstorms will continue over eastern Arizona and New Mexico, spreading into portions of the Texas panhandle as well. Scattered showers with isolated thunderstorms are likely across the Great Lakes with an upper low. Light rain, possibly mixed with snow, is forecast to develop overnight across portions of the northern High Plains.

## Aviation Watch Outs Aviation Category

As part of risk management, especially during high activity fires, each aviation manager and employee should be asking questions about every mission.

- Is the flight necessary?
- Who is in charge?
- Are hazards identified and known?
  - Have flight hazards been assessed? Have the pilots been informed?
- Should the operation or the flight be stopped due to a change in conditions? Consider the following:
  - Radio communications.
  - Environmental conditions – weather, visibility, terrain, elevation, temperatures.
  - Mission priorities.
  - Successful mission completion probabilities.
- Is there a better way to complete the mission?
- Is there pressure to complete a mission at all costs?
- Can you justify your actions?
- Is the mission airspace confined or congested?
  - Multiple aircraft.
  - Mixed types of aircraft.
  - Poor visibility.
- Do you have an escape route?
- Are any guidelines or policies being ignored?
- Is communication between any individuals strained or tense?
- Are you deviating from the assigned operation or flight?
